





















Directions to the Park and Our 2017 Field Day Site

- Take the LIE or Northern State to Deer Park Ave North, Exits 51N (LIE) or 42N (NSP).
- When you get off the NSP or as you pass there on Deer Park Ave get into the left lane.
- Deer Park Ave bears to the left just after the fire house and you have to be in the left lane.
- Continue on Deer Park Ave to route 25. At route 25 continue straight ahead. Note that the Deer Park Avenue changes its street name to Park Ave once you cross Route 25.
- Continue on Park Ave to route 25A.
- Make a left on 25A (Main St). Go through town, past the route 110 intersection.
- Three blocks past Route 110, make a right turn on to West Neck Rd. (Traffic light at intersection). West Neck Rd might be called Lloyd Harbor Rd at times.
- Once you go across the causeway, the entrance to Caumsett State park will be on your left about 3/4 to 1 mile down the road.
